


PERSONALITIES OF THE MONTH

Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose was born on 23rd January, 1897 in Cuttack to Janaki Nath Bose and Prabhavati Bose and he had 13 siblings. He was married to an Austrian woman Emilie Shinken. His daughter Anita Bose Later became a popular economist in Germany. His words “Give me blood and I shall give you freedom” sparked the patriotism in the hearts of many Indians to join the fight for country’s Independence. Even today, these words don’t fail to inspire and move us. He was a great freedom fighter who rebelled against the British and did his part to help India achieve Independence.

He died on 18th August 1945 in a hospital in Taiwan after suffering from the burn injuries sustained in a plane crash.

HAPPY SUBHASH CHANDRA BOSE JAYANTI

SWAMI VIVEKANANDA:

Swami Vivekananda was born on 12 January, 1863, as Narendra Nath Dutta. He was a chief disciple of the 19th century Indian Mystic Ramakrishna. Swami Vivekananda came under international spotlight after his enticing speech at the Parliament of Religions in Chicago in 1893. He was known for his Vedanta's philosophy and became India's spiritual ambassador, becoming a bridge of religion and science between East and West.

He focused on the channelling of the energy of the youth. He stated that "Youth is the most important segment of any country". He said "All power is within you, you can do anything and everything". His Birth Anniversary is celebrated as "*National Youth Day*" through out the country.

SILHOUETTE PAINTING



Material Required:


- Watercolor paper, Watercolor paints
- Brush
- Cutting blade or scissors
- Pencil
- Print out of any subject with an interesting silhouette (animal, plant, etc)

Method: To compose silhouette painting take your watercolor, make sure your print out fits comfortably on the watercolor paper. Cut the object out from the print and place it on the watercolor paper. Lightly trace the cut-out with a pencil. **This is the key:** Use your brush to wet the entire background around your tracing (you can even tint the water with a dab of watercolor paint to see if you missed a spot). Next, load your brush with the paint and touch your brush to the paper. The paint will spread only on the wet areas, leaving the inside of your tracing dry. Continue filling in the background with watercolors. Step back occasionally to see if your object's silhouette is defined. Once you are satisfied, let the painting dry and then display it!
